What Makes the World Go Round?

The musical *Cabaret* gives us the well-known lyric “*Money makes the world go around.*” Considering the state of the world economy today, I hope that’s not true! In 1961, Bob Merrill wrote the popular song *Love Makes the World Go Round* for the musical play *Carnival*. While those sentiments are closer to the truth, they still fall short.

So, what does make the world go round—money, love? St. Luke recounts two stories I believe point us in the right direction.

Jesus told this story: “A rich man had a fertile farm that produced fine crops. He said to himself, ‘What should I do? I don’t have room for all my crops.’ Then he said, ‘I know! I’ll tear down my barns and build bigger ones. Then I’ll have room enough to store all my wheat and other goods. And I’ll sit back and say to myself, “My friend, you have enough stored away for years to come. Now take it easy! Eat, drink, and be merry!” “But God said to him, ‘You fool! You will die this very night. Then who will get everything you worked for?’ **“Yes, a person is a fool to store up earthly wealth but not have a rich relationship with God.”** (Luke 12:16-21).

The next story is slightly more familiar.

While Jesus was in the Temple, he watched the rich people dropping their gifts in the collection box. Then a poor widow came by and dropped in two small coins. “I tell you the truth,” Jesus said, “this poor widow has given more than all the rest of them. For they have given a tiny part of their surplus, but she, **poor as she is, has given everything she has.**” (Luke 21:1-4).

Together, these stories point out one of the most important truths of life! Neither money nor love can sustain us throughout life. If we expect to live an abundant and eternal life, we need to maintain a close relationship with God. The rich man trusted in money and lost everything. The poor widow gave everything and found a rich relationship with God.

This week you will receive your **2011 In His Steps Financial Stewardship Packet**. *I encourage you to ask Jesus what you can sacrificially give to support the work of God’s Kingdom through Heritage.* Each week we see the many ways God touches lives through Heritage Church. There are many things we can do with our money in an attempt to seek happiness. Many will work in the short-term, but only what we give to God’s Kingdom will last.

So, what makes the world go around? The answer is Jesus. Colossians 1:17 tells us, “*He existed before anything else, and he holds all creation together.*” Every blessing we have in life comes from Christ. Let’s do all we can financially to spread the Good News to others.

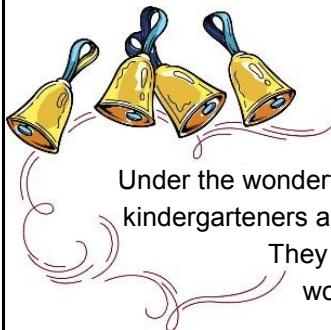

**Heritage has a goal of filling 100 shoe boxes for Operation Christmas Child!
Collection bins will be located at the main church entrances through Nov. 14.**

Gift suggestions:

- **School supplies** (pens, pencils, sharpeners, markers, stamps/ink pads, writing pads & paper, solar calculators, coloring & picture books)
- **Toys** (small cars, balls, dolls, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes, small Etch-a-Sketches, toys that light up or make noise -- with extra batteries, Slinky toys)
- **Hygiene Items** (toothbrushes, toothpaste, bars of mild soap in plastic bags, combs, washcloths)
- **Other** (hard candy/lollipops, mints, gum, T-shirts, socks, ball caps, sunglasses, hair clips, toy jewelry, watches, flashlights/extra batteries)
- **A personal note.** You may enclose a note to the child and a photo of yourself or your family.
- **Money** to help with shipping or to purchase additional items to fill the boxes! Samaritan's Purse requests \$7 per box for shipping costs.
- **Please do NOT include** used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives, or military figures; chocolate or food; out-of-date candy; liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans.

We do NOT need any shoeboxes this year!

We had many boxes left from last year. Also, we are trying to use plastic boxes & lids this year. For many recipients, the plastic boxes are a wonderful gift since these boxes may be used to transport water or store food.

We will line the boxes with Christmas-printed tissue paper, so donations of that would be appreciated.

MONEY-SAVING TIP! If you have leftover "prizes" or candy (that won't melt) after Trick-or-Trunk, place them in an Operation Christmas Child collection bin!

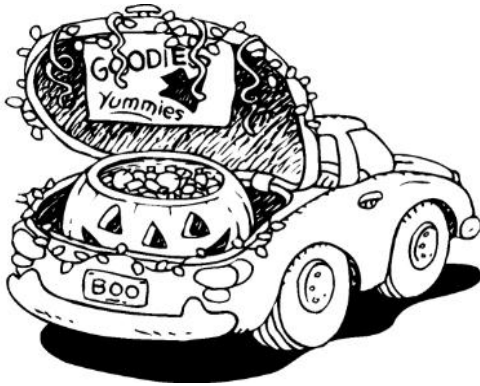

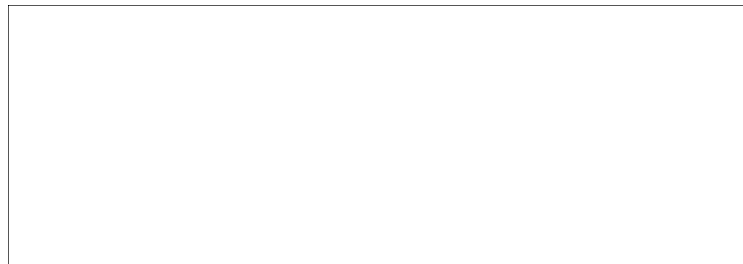
